
Hi-Start Care

G.L.: What mistakes can I avoid with a Surgical Tubing Rubber shock cord for launching radio gliders?

ANSWER: Don't leave it hanging around to begin with. I've found every modeler coming into the house automatically grabs it and tries to see how tough it is before even knowing what it's for. If they've got enough muscles they might weaken it. Do keep it out of the sun when not in use and store in a cool, dark container as you would a rubber motor. Examine the length from time to time for tears and try to anchor end without a human hanging on. It's a pile of worms if it comes loose!

30 seconds on a handlaunch? Not bad time! In fact it's pretty good for a Ready-To-Fly Glider. It's something we've sorely needed to give a young modeler his first feel of real performance. While it won't exactly top the best arms at the Nationals. it will corkscrew up to thermal territory. A kid can get turned off with a balsa stick that loops into the cement, but "Super Glider" is a molded foam and boom creation that is ready for the air as you leave the dealer's shop.

"Super Glider" turns in 30 second flights in the hands of eight and ten year old boys. The wings remain attached even when thrown by top adult glider pros. The N.D.C. Corporation manufactures the Glider. It measures 16-1/2" overall and 14" in span. with a wide chord. Flying weight is 25 grams. Wings and tail are of styrofoam, a tapered wood boom and a nylon fuselage, sleek, modern in layout with elliptical dihedral. Three trim colors to choose from: red, blue or gold. With a price of \$1.29 retail, it can't miss. One California club has added a "Commercial Handlaunch" event for Junior flyers to encourage youthful activity. Try airlifting one on your R/C ship. That could be fun!

Apollo Adjust-Tow Hook

Wind velocity dictates hook position and repositioning a rugged towhook is something modelers tend to not do in the heat of the flying action.



Apollo Model Specialities, 202 South Kenosha Drive, Madison, Wisconsin 53705 has come to the rescue. Their new "Adjust-Tow" Hook can give you positions in increments of 1/4" over a 1-3/4" range. Further, it looks to be extremely easy to mount, enough holes to screw it to anything. It is neat, light, compact and offers nothing but the hook itself for drag. Price is \$1.79, through Ace R/C or direct from the manufacturer.
